UKULELE LEARNING TIPS

- ❖ If you are having trouble fretting (fingering) a chord, you can just *not* strum (or pick) one of the notes (strings), and just strum or pick the other three. This works best when it is an outside string (first or last string).
- ❖ If necessary, find your own way (fingering, etc.) to play a chord. How someone else plays it won't work for everyone.
- ❖ Give yourself credit when you learn something, and don't compare yourself to others who are "better." Just realize that *you* are better than you used to be.
- ❖ Have fun, and enjoy the music that you are making.
