## 4 MAIN UKULELE SIZES (from smallest to largest, with typical lengths)

- soprano (21.0" length) concert (24.0") tenor (26.5") baritone (30")
- tunings: usually gCEA (high g) or GCEA (low G), except DGBE (low D) dGBE (high d) for baritone

## **CHOOSING A SIZE**

The overall size affects how it feels to hold the ukulele, the ukulele's sound, and the fret spacing.

## COST OF A NEW UKULELE

- \$45+ (laminate wood or plastic) \$125+ (solid wood top) \$160+ (all solid wood)
- plus: clip-on tuner (\$15 & up), gig bag or hard case (\$50+), humidifier (for solid wood ukes); a hard case is usually better when humidifying a solid-wood uke

#### WHERE TO FIND YOUR UKULELE (with advantages of each)

Borrowing from a Library: Some local libraries lend ukuleles, so you can try one at no cost. Buying from a local store (advantages):

- you can try out ukuleles in person (but bring, borrow or buy a clip-on tuner)
- it should be simpler to make a return (but check the store policy)
- you are supporting a local business
- you can bring an experienced ukulele player with you to help you in your purchase

# Buying online (advantages):

- usually there is more selection brands, price range, types
- there might be reliable (not falsified) sound samples <u>TheUkuleleSite.com</u> has reliable ones.
- a set-up (which makes the uke easier to play) and inspection usually is available (see below)
- people who work at the online stores listed below understand and appreciate ukuleles

#### Suggested online stores - each one sets up ukuleles (inspects & makes needed adjustments):

 \*<u>TheUkuleleSite.com</u> - Ukes can cost more, due to being located in Hawaii; they set up ukuleles \$399-and-up for free, and for \$20 or \$30 otherwise. Shipping is free with orders \$500 and up.
<u>AlohaCityUkes.com</u> - low-cost ukes include Ohana & Kala brands; free shipping with \$150+ order
<u>PennyLaneEmporium.com</u> - also has Ohana, Kala, and other brands; free shipping on \$100+ order.
\*<u>Uke-Fan.com</u> - email <u>fanguitarandukulele@gmail.com</u> or call (804) 254-4600 for inventory beyond what is on their site. Purchase includes a set-up, and shipping is free with an order over \$200.

**Recommended Online/Local:** <u>MagicFluke.com</u> (or visit them in Sheffield, MA) sells sturdy ukes that are fun to play and have an authentic ukulele sound – made locally, plus great customer service. **Recommended starter ukuleles:** Ohana or Kala (among other brands) offer a range of ukuleles sizes, types, and prices. Other, sometimes less-expensive options include a soprano or concert size Enya Nova U or Flight (available online).
